Mole Valley Bowmen Winter 2023-24 Program

The following sets out the club's shooting program for the winter months. It covers notable events for your dairies – generally coloured coded – and a suggested guide, nothing more, to the archery rounds to be shot on other days (see notes at the end for details on a 'round').

Shooting times

Unless the program shows something different, shooting is from 2pm on a Sunday during BST, 1pm on a Sunday when the clocks go back. Indoor shooting is 7pm on a Monday at Ewell Castle School. We all have other commitments that sometimes make these times impractical, but we should all do our fair share of setting up and putting way over the season.

Easter Sunday is **NOT** a shooting day, but we do shoot on all Bank Holiday Mondays as if they are Sunday, and not in the evening.

Events at St Martin's

Sunday 17th December - Christmas Shoot and Meal (start time tbc)

Every year we meet on the field for a fun shoot (organised by last year's 'winner') in the morning, and then go for a Christmas lunch. We use the club jelly bows to make things more interesting! Details will be shared closer to the time.

Sunday 17th March – Birthday Shoot (start time tbc)

Another fun shoot to celebrate the founding of the club. Details will be shared closer to the time.

Club Competitions & Postal Competitions

During the winter we take part in two postal (virtual) competitions.

Portsmouth: this is shot indoors on Monday evenings from Nov to Mar at Ewell Castle School – shown in blue. The round is a Portsmouth (5 doz arrows at 20 yds on a 60cm face). This is also a club competition (see below).

Frostbite: this is shot outdoors on Sunday afternoons from Nov to Mar at St Martins' School – shown in yellow. The round is a Frostbite (3 doz arrows at 30 m on an 80cm face). This is also a club competition (see below).

There are four club competitions: Portsmouth (blue), WA18 (purple) and WA25 (grey) shot indoors, and the Frostbite (yellow) shot outdoors.

To take part, shoot and score on the dates shown, and submit your scores to Cameron. Trophies will be awarded on a handicap basis, normally on the best 3 or 4 scores over the season.

Improver Sessions

These are held on the last Sunday of most months: 11:30am setup. No booking required.

Mud

Please scrape your boots as you leave the field.

Lost Arrows

Lost Arrows are not allowed. All arrows must be found since we are using a school playing field. However, if after all efforts have been made no arrow has been found, please notify both the School and the Club Secretary as we must minute these instances for insurance purposes. We need to know roughly where it was lost and have a description of the arrow (e.g., type, length, fletching colour etc.). Blank forms for this are in the container and copy should be dropped through the door of the school and a copy sent to mvb.sec@gmail.com. Please also let us know if it is found later.

Rounds

There is nothing mysterious about rounds. There is a list of rounds on the inside of the right-hand container door.

A round is simply the name given to a set number of arrows shot at different distances, some based on yards and 9-7-5-3-1 scoring – Imperial Rounds, some based on meters and 10 zone scoring – Metric rounds. Most outdoor rounds consist of either 12, 9, 8, 6 or 4 dozen arrows shot in ends of 6 arrows, whereas a typical indoor round is 5 dozen arrows shot in ends of 3 arrows.

Many of the Imperial rounds are named after English place names and are evocative of history e.g., York, Hereford, St George, Albion, Portsmouth, Warwick, Windsor, Bristol, Stafford - the metric ones are maybe a bit less imaginative – Long Metric, Short Metric, WA 1440 etc.
